

The power it takes to force people to surrender reserves compassion, empathy, and respect for the person who seeks that power.




Speech

Some people reach for their dictionary to justify refusing to acknowledge any of socialism's mechanisms absent a deed to all of society noting Government as owner of record.


Speech codes exhaust any notion of rights, including a right to the words coming out of your mouth.

Science isn't science until the results of scientific experiments are understood as sacrifices everyone should make.




Tariffs are socialism.

The promise of a massive public transportation system increases the inequality between the USA and places where the primary form of transportation is the feet at the end of one's legs.


The USA has income inequality with countries which have the same amount of income inequality as the USA.




Free Tuition

What isn't the ownership of resources and the means of production, is the attrition of those things.


What one person could own, everyone shall be promised until there's none left.
